



Safety Precautions and Maintenance



FOR OPTIMUM PERFORMANCE, PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING WHEN SETTING UP AND USING THE LCD COLOR MONITOR:

- DO NOT OPEN THE MONITOR. There are no user serviceable parts inside and opening or removing covers may expose
 you to dangerous shock hazards or other risks. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.
- · Do not spill any liquids into the cabinet or use your monitor near water.
- Do not insert objects of any kind into the cabinet slots as they may touch dangerous voltage points, which can be harmful or fatal, or may cause electric shock, fire or equipment failure.
- Do not place any heavy objects on the power cord. Damage to the cord may cause shock or fire.
- Do not place this product on a sloping or unstable cart, stand or table, as the monitor may fall, causing serious damage to the monitor.
- The power supply cord you use must have been approved by and comply with the safety standards of your country. (e.g. Type H05VV-F 3G 0.75 mm² should be used in Europe).

 The monitor should be installed close to a power outlet which is easily accessible.
- · Handle with care when transporting. Save packaging for transporting.
- Handle with care during installation and adjustment to prevent personal injury and damage to the monitor.
- Please tighten all screws. A loose screw may cause the monitor to fall off the arm or stand.
- Do not touch the LCD panel surface while transporting, mounting and setting.
 Applying pressure on the LCD panel can cause serious damage.

Image Persistence: Image persistence occurs when a residual or "ghost" image of a previous image remains visible on the screen. Unlike CRT monitors, LCD monitors' image persistence is not permanent, but a still image being displayed for a long period of time should be avoided.

To alleviate image persistence, turn off the monitor for as long as the previous image was displayed. For example, if an image was on the monitor for one hour and a residual image remains, the monitor should be turned off for one hour to erase the image.

NOTE: As with all personal display devices, NEC DISPLAY SOLUTIONS recommends using a moving screen saver at regular intervals whenever the screen is idle, or turn off the monitor when not in use.

CORRECT PLACEMENT AND ADJUSTMENT OF THE MONITOR CAN REDUCE EYE, SHOULDER, AND NECK FATIGUE. CHECK THE FOLLOWING WHEN YOU POSITION THE MONITOR:

Ergonomics

To realize the maximum ergonomics benefits, we recommend the following:

- For optimum performance of the monitor, allow 20 minutes for warming up. Avoid reproduction of still patterns on the monitor for long periods of time to avoid image persistence (after image effects).
- Adjust the monitor height so that the top of the screen is at or slightly below eye level.
 Your eyes should look slightly downward when viewing the middle of the screen.
- Position your monitor no closer than 40 cm (15.75 inches) and no further away than 70 cm (27.56 inches) from your eyes. The optimal distance is 50 cm (19.69 inches).
- Rest your eyes periodically for 5 to 10 minutes for every 1 hour by focusing on an object at least 20 feet away.
- Position the monitor at a 90° angle to windows and other light sources to minimize glare and reflections. Adjust the monitor tilt so that ceiling lights do not reflect on your screen.
- If reflected light makes it hard for you to see your screen, use an anti-glare filter.
- · Adjust the monitor's brightness and contrast controls to enhance readability.
- Use a document holder placed close to the screen.
- Position whatever you are looking at most of the time (the screen or reference material) directly in front of you to minimize turning your head while you are typing.
- Blink often. Eye exercise helps to reduce eye strain. Please contact your ophthalmologist. Get regular eye checkups.
- To avoid eye fatigue, adjust the brightness to a moderate setting. Place a sheet of white paper next to the LCD screen for luminance reference.
- Do not position the Contrast control to its maximum setting.
- Use the preset Size and Position controls with standard signals.
- · Use the preset Color Setting.
- · Use non-interlaced signals.
- Do not use primary color blue on a dark background, as it is difficult to see and may produce eye fatigue due to insufficient contrast
- Suitable for entertainment purposes at controlled luminous environments, to avoid disturbing reflections from the screen.

Cleaning the LCD Panel


- When the LCD is dusty, please gently wipe with a soft cloth.
- Clean the LCD monitor surface with a lint-free, non-abrasive cloth. Avoid using any cleaning solution or glass cleaner!
- Please do not rub the LCD panel with hard or coarse material.
- Please do not apply pressure to the LCD surface.
- Please do not use OA cleaner as it will cause deterioration or discoloration on the LCD panel surface.

Cleaning the Cabinet

- Unplug the power supply
- · Gently wipe the cabinet with a soft cloth
- · To clean the cabinet, dampen the cloth with a neutral detergent and water, wipe the cabinet and follow with a dry cloth.

NOTE: DO NOT clean with benzene thinner, alkaline detergent, alcoholic system detergent, glass cleaner, wax, polish cleaner, soap powder, or insecticide. Rubber or vinyl should not be in contact with the cabinet for an extended period of time. These types of fluids and materials can cause the paint to deteriorate, crack or peel.



- *1 Type and number of power cords included will depend on the where the LCD monitor is to be shipped. When more than one power cord is included, please use a power cord that matches the AC voltage of the power outlet and has been approved by and complies with the safety standard of your particular country.

Quick Start

To attach the stand neck and base stand to the LCD stand:

1. Attach the stand neck to the monitor. And then, attach the base stand to the stand. The locking tabs on the base stand should fit into the hole on the stand neck (**Figure 1**).

To connect the LCD monitor to your system, follow these instructions:

- 1. Turn off the power to your computer.
- For a PC or MAC with DVI digital output: Connect the DVI signal cable (not included) to the connector of the display card in your system (Figure A.1). Tighten all screws.

For a PC with Analog output: Connect a 15-pin mini D-SUB signal cable to the connector of the display card in your system (**Figure A.2**).

For a MAC: Connect a Macintosh cable adapter (not included) to the computer, then attach the 15-pin mini D-SUB signal cable to the Macintosh cable adapter (**Figure A.3**).


Stand Neck

The arrow, which is imprinted on the base stand, shows the front side direction.

NOTE: Some Macintosh systems do not require a Macintosh cable adapter.

⚠ CAUTION: Use the provided specified cables with this monitor so as not to interfere with radio and television reception. For DVI-D and mini D-Sub 15-pin, please use a shielded signal cable with ferrite core.

Use of other cables and adapters may cause interference with radio and television reception.







3. Connect all cables to the appropriate connectors (Figure C.1).

NOTE: Incorrect cable connections may result in irregular operation, damage display quality/components of LCD module and/or shorten the module's life.

4. Connect one end of the power cord to the AC inlet on the back of the monitor and the other end to the power outlet.

NOTE: Please refer to CAUTION section of this manual for proper selection of AC power cord.

- 5. Turn on the monitor with the front power button (Figure E.1) and the computer.
- 6. No-touch auto adjust automatically adjusts the monitor to optimal settings upon initial setup for most timings. For further adjustments, use the following OSD controls:
 - Auto Contrast (Analog input only)
 - Auto Adjust (Analog input only)

Refer to the Controls section of this User's Manual for a full description of these OSD controls.

NOTE: If you have any problems, please refer to the Troubleshooting section of this User's Manual.





Tilt

Grasp top and bottom sides of the monitor screen with your hands and adjust the tilt as desired (Figure TS.1).

NOTE: Handle with care when tilting the monitor screen.

Repacking

Remove base stand and stand neck for repacking.

- 1. Disconnect all cables.
- 2. Place monitor face down on a non-abrasive surface.
- 3. Remove base stand. Move up tabs and take off the base stand (Figure S.1).
- 4. Remove stand neck. Push down 2 tabs and remove stand neck (Figure S.2).

NOTE: Handle with care when removing base stand and stand neck. If you have difficulty removing the base stand, please move base stand left and right in small motion.



Flexible Arm Installation

This LCD monitor is designed for use with a flexible arm. Contact NEC for more information.

To prepare the monitor for alternate mounting purposes:

- Follow the instructions provided by the manufacturer of the display mount.
- ⚠ CAUTION: To meet the safety requirements, the monitor must be mounted to an arm that supports the weight of the monitor and be UL-certified.

See page 12 for details. Remove the base stand before mounting.



To prepare the monitor for alternate mounting purposes:

- 1. Disconnect all cables.
- 2. Place monitor face down on a non-abrasive surface.
- 3. Move up tabs and take off the base stand (**Figure S.1**). The monitor can now be mounted using an alternate method. Reverse process to reattach stand.

NOTE: Handle with care when removing monitor stand.

If you have difficulty removing the base stand,
please move base stand left and right in small motion.

Do not remove stand neck when you use mounting method.


This LCD monitor is designed for use with a flexible arm.

- Follow the instructions on how Remove Base Stand for Mounting to remove the base stand.
- 2. Please use screws (4pcs) as shown in the picture when installing.

Caution: To meet the safety requirements, the monitor must be mounted to an arm which, guaranties the necessary stability under consideration of the weight of the monitor. The LCD monitor shall only be used with an approved arm (e.g. GS mark).



2. OSD structure



-<u>Ö</u>-**BRIGHTNESS**

Adjusts the overall image and background screen brightness.

To enter the ECO MODE, press the "INPUT/RESET" button.

ECO MODE OFF: Sets brightness variable from 0% to 100%.

ECO MODE1: Sets brightness 80%.

This setting automatically adjusts brightness within a power consumption range that meets Energy Star measurement conditions.

ECO MODE2: Sets brightness 40%.

This setting can adjust brightness within the range that power has reduced 45% from maximum brightness setting.

NOTE: When DV MODE is ON, ECO MODE is set to OFF and cannot be changed.

CONTRAST

Adjusts the image brightness in relation to the background.

To enter the DV MODE setting, select CONTRAST icon and set DV MODE to OFF then touch the "INPUT/RESET" key.

DV MODE: Setting that adjusts the brightness by detecting the screen's black areas and optimizes it.

NOTE: "OFF" is used for TCO Certificate compliance.

AUTO AUTO CONTRAST (Analog input only)

Adjusts the image displayed for non-standard video inputs.

AUTO }}→|| **AUTO ADJUST (Analog input only)**

Automatically adjusts the Image Position, the H. Size and Fine setting.

LEFT/RIGHT (Analog input only)

Controls Horizontal Image Position within the display area of the LCD.

DOWN/UP (Analog input only)

Controls Vertical Image Position within the display area of the LCD.

\leftrightarrow H. SIZE (Analog input only)

Adjusts the horizontal size by increasing or decreasing this setting.

{{}→|| FINE (Analog input only)

Improves focus, clarity and image stability by increasing or decreasing this setting.

NATIVE COLOR CONTROL SYSTEMS

Five color presets (9300/7500/sRGB/USER/NATIVE) select the desired color setting.

R COLOR RED

Increase or decreases Red. The change will appear on screen.

G COLOR GREEN

Increase or decreases Green. The change will appear on screen.

B COLOR BLUE

Increase or decreases Blue. The change will appear on screen.

Selecting TOOL allows you to get into the sub menu.

FACTORY PRESET

Selecting Factory Preset allows you to reset all OSD control settings back to the factory settings. The INPUT/RESET button will need to be held down for several seconds to take effect. Individual settings can be reset by highlighting the control to be reset and pressing the INPUT/RESET button.

EXT **EXIT**

Selecting EXIT allows you exit OSD menu/ sub menu.

OSD control menus are available in nine languages.

OSD TURN OFF

The OSD control menu will stay on as long as it is in use. In the OSD Turn OFF submenu, you can select how long the monitor waits after the last touch of a button to shut off the OSD control menu. The preset choices are 10 - 120 seconds by 5 seconds step.

B™ OSD LOCK OUT

This control completely locks out access to all OSD control functions except for BRIGHTNESS and CONTRAST. To activate the OSD LOCK OUT function, enter TOOL submenu, select "OSD LOCK OUT", press and hold "INPUT/RESET" and "+" simultaneously until "OSD LOCKED OUT" indicator appears. To deactivate, press SELECT, then repeat the same steps until OSD main menu displays on screen.

SIGNAL INFORMATION

If you select "ON", monitor displays "VIDEO INPUT MENU" after changing the input. If you select "OFF", monitor doesn't display "VIDEO INPUT MENU" after changing the input.

EXPANSION

Selects the zoom mode.

This function works, when input signal timing is under native resolution.

FULL: The image is expanded to full screen, regardless of the resolution.

ASPECT: The image is expanded without changing the aspect ratio.

DDC/CI

Turns ON or OFF the two way communication and control of the monitor.

CARBON SAVINGS

Displays the estimated carbon saving information in kg.

The carbon footprint factor in the carbon saving calculation is based on the OECD (2008 Edition).

The carbon saving information can be reset by pressing the INPUT/RESET button.

CARBON USAGE

Displays the estimated carbon usages information in kg. This is the arithmetic estimation, not actual measurement value.

MONITOR INFO

Indicates the model and serial numbers of your monitor.

INPUT RESOLUTION (Analog input only)

This function works, when user selects below special input signal timing.

Select resolution's priority of input signal to one of the following signal: 1280x768, 1360x768 and 1366x768 or 1400x1050 and 1680x1050.

1280x768, 1360x768, 1366x768: Determines the resolution to 1280x768, 1360x768 or 1366x768.

1400x1050, 1680x1050: Determines the resolution to 1400x1050 or 1680x1050.

OSD Warning

OSD Warning menus disappear by pressing SELECT.

NO SIGNAL: This function gives a warning when there is no signal present. After power is turned on or when there is a change of input signal or video is inactive, the **NO SIGNAL** window will appear.

OUT OF RANGE: This function gives a recommendation of the optimized resolution and refresh rate. After the power is turned on or there is a change of input signal or the video signal doesn't have proper timing, the **OUT OF RANGE** menu will appear.

In flat panel technologies, each dot on the screen is actually one pixel, so to expand resolutions to full screen, an interpolation of the resolution must be done.

Troubleshooting

No picture

- The signal cable should be completely connected to the display card/computer.
- · The display card should be completely seated in its slot.
- Check front power switch and computer power switch should be in the ON position.
- Check to make sure that a supported mode has been selected on the display card or system being used.
 (Please consult display card or system manual to change graphics mode.)
- Check the monitor and your display card with respect to compatibility and recommended settings.
- · Check the signal cable connector for bent or pushed-in pins.
- · Check the signal input.

Power Button does not respond

Unplug the power cord of the monitor from the AC outlet to turn off and reset the monitor.

Image persistence

Image persistence is when a "ghost" of an image remains on the screen even after the monitor has been turned off.
 Unlike CRT monitors, LCD monitors' image persistence is not permanent, but constant images being displayed for a long period of time should be avoided.

To alleviate image persistence, turn the monitor off for as long as an image was displayed. For example, if an image was on the monitor for one hour and a residual image remains, the monitor should be turned off for one hour to erase the image.

NOTE: As with all personal display devices, NEC DISPLAY SOLUTIONS recommends using a screen saver at regular intervals whenever the screen is idle or turning off the monitor when not in use.

Message "OUT OF RANGE" is displayed (screen is either blank or shows rough images only)

- Image is displayed only roughly (pixels are missing) and OSD warning "OUT OF RANGE" is displayed: Either signal clock or resolution is too high. Choose one of the supported modes.
- OSD warning "OUT OF RANGE" is displayed on a blank screen: Signal frequency is out of range. Choose one of the supported modes.

Image is unstable, unfocused or swimming is apparent

- Signal cable should be completely attached to the computer.
- Use the OSD Image Adjust controls to focus and adjust display by increasing or decreasing the fine total.
 When the display mode is changed, the OSD Image Adjust settings may need to be re-adjusted.
- · Check the monitor and your display card with respect to compatibility and recommended signal timings.
- If your text is garbled, change the video mode to non-interlace and use 60Hz refresh rate.

LED on monitor is not lit (no blue or amber color can be seen)

• Power Switch should be in the ON position and power cord should be connected.

Picture is not as bright

- · Make sure ECO MODE is turned off.
- If the brightness fluctuates, make sure DV MODE is set to OFF.

Display image is not sized properly

- Use the OSD Image Adjust controls to increase or decrease the H.SIZE.
- Check to make sure that a supported mode has been selected on the display card or system being used.
 (Please consult display card or system manual to change graphics mode.)

No Video

- If no video is present on the screen, turn the Power button off and on again.
- Make certain the computer is not in a power-saving mode (touch the keyboard or mouse).

Brightness variations over time

· Change DV MODE to OFF and adjust brightness.

NOTE: When DV MODE is set to ON, the monitor automatically adjusts brightness.
